- Targeted Approach


Implementation Grants: Phase 2

Responsibilities of Grantees

- Attend one virtual meeting of all grantees at project midpoint to share progress, lessons learned and ask questions
- Participate in online learning community opportunity to share lessons learned and engage with other grantees
- End of project reporting # of pediatric COVID-19 vaccines and nonpediatric COVID-19 vaccines administered (shots in arms); # of vaccine confidence activities; summary of project highlighting what worked and what did not

NASN: Community Support & TA

- Virtual Learning Exchange dedicated online community for grantees to meet up, receive technical assistance, access resources and share findings. Specific professional development on vaccine confidence, and access opportunities (mobile clinics, SLVs, etc.)

Instructions for creating NASN account and logging into application portal

It is important that you do not create a new account if you already have one. If you only need assistance logging in, contact NASN at nasn@nasn.org

- 1. Start at the LOGIN form [https://my.nasn.org/account/login.aspx]
- 2. Select create an account.
- 3. Enter your name, email address, a password, and other information requested.
- 4. Locate and reply to the email requesting you verify your email address.
- 5. Once you have verified your email address you can access the Grant Application. See instructions for submitting a Grant Application below.

Navigating the Grant Application

- 1.Go to the submission software. [https://nasn.slayte.com/]
- 2.Select Register/Log in.
- 3.On the Sign In pop-up box, click on the NASN logo.
- 4.Enter your NASN username and password.
- 5.Select Calls.
- 6. Select Champions for School Health Grant Application.
- 7. Read the summary information.
